Our Initiatives for Europe

From early on, Kobe University has recognised the crucial importance of partnership with universities and institutions in Europe.

As a coordinating university of the EU Institute in Japan, Kansai (EUIJ-Kansai), a consortium formed by three universities in the region in 2005 with financial support from the European Commission, Kobe University organises a variety of programmes and events to raise awareness about the EU, its policies and aspirations among the Japanese public. As part of these efforts, our University has hosted numerous visits by distinguished guests representing the EU such as His Excellency Mr Herman Van Rompuy, President of the European Council, His Excellency Mr José Manuel Barroso, President of the European Commission and His Excellency Dr. Hans-Gert Pöttering, President of the European Parliament.

The Kobe University Brussels European Centre was established in 2010 to enhance our international competitiveness and promote the exchange of students and researchers between Japan and Europe. It was the first overseas office established in Brussels by a Japanese University (the centre was relocated to one of Kobe University's partner institutes, Vrije Universiteit Brussel, in 2015.) Kobe University has since held many international symposia and workshops in Brussels attended by world-renowned scholars and dignitaries. To promote further collaboration with institutions in Europe, in 2011 the Kobe University Research and Education Centre for Europe was established on campus to serve as the headquarters of European relations (renamed the Centre for EU Academic Collaboration in 2015).

Our University is actively participating in education programmes with Europe including Erasmus+, the Kobe University Programme for European Studies (KUPES) and double degree programmes such as the EU-JAMM, ICI-ECP double-degree project. In recognition of our initiatives for Europe, in 2015 Kobe University was the only Japanese institution to be named a Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence, an open programme of the European Commission which supports academic centres specialising in EU studies.

Kobe University has also established liaison offices at Jagiellonian University in Poland (2016) and Babeş-Bolyai University in Romania (2018). Through these two offices, the University promotes collaboration with Central and Eastern European countries, including participation in the Visegrad Project.

KUBEC is a member of University Liaison Office Network 'UniLION' and through this network, KUBEC has built networks with European universities and gathered information about European research and education grants. In 2017, KUBEC also appointed an advisor who has a long-term career in DG for Research and Innovation. With his advice and close connections with various organisations of the European Union, Kobe University is now actively involved in European programmes. KUBEC also supports Kobe University researchers to establish networks and apply for European funding schemes.





2 Establish International Networks

KUBEC has been widely utilised for establishing academic networks. The annual KUBEC international symposium is an event that has particularly cemented Kobe University's presence in Europe. Workshops are held more than 5 times a year at KUBEC by Kobe University researchers with European partners to foster their joint research activities. Over the last 10 years, around 50 workshops have attracted the participation of more than 600 researchers participated.




