

Mr. Takeo Fukui Project Coordinator Section on Earth Sciences and Geo-Hazards Risk Reduction, Division of Ecological and Earth Sciences, Natural Sciences Sector, UNESCO



Takeo Fukui is Project Coordinator of Division of Ecological and Earth Sciences, Section on Earth Sciences and Geo-Hazards Risk Reduction, Natural Sciences Sector, UNESCO. He has been involved policy development of Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) for 18 years. He joined Ministry of Construction of Japan in 2000. He contributed to amendment of building codes (Structural, Fire prevention, etc.) in Housing Bureau and policy development for reconstructing from the Great East Japan Earthquake at City Bureau. He also engaged in policy for disaster rehabilitation and reconstruction at Cabinet Office (Disaster Management) and policy for prevention of housing fire at Fire and Disaster Management Agency. Since September 2017, he is working at Natural Sciences Sector, UNESCO, and he is in charge of DRR such as International Platform for Reducing Earthquake Disasters (IPRED).



Panelists Ms. Melyza Perdana Gadjah Mada University (Indonesia)

Melyza Perdana is a lecturer in department of medical surgical nursing, faculty of medicine, public health and nursing. She completed her bachelor in UGM and her master in National Cheng King University, Taiwan. Currently she is responsible for collaboration and development in school of Nursing, UGM. And she is also involving in some voluntary activities related to disaster in Jogjakarta. For instance in managing victims of Bantul Earthquake 2006 and merapi eruption 2010. In 2006, School of Nursing UGM conducted a mobile rehabilitation for victims in Bantul Earthquake funded by JICA, Japan. In the following year, School of Nursing also held an educational program for health cadre with topic "Emergency Respond Training." In 2010, School of Nursing also actively involved in responding Merapi Eruption. Besides managing the charity from all over Indonesia, SoN UGM also manage the shelter for the victims as well as support the psychological aspect of the victims through training.

Mr. Mohd Hafiz Amirrol MERCY Malaysia (Malaysia)



Hafiz is Head of Building Resilient Communities at MERCY Malaysia, whose works focuses on strategic initiatives in building resilience across communities and places, with current project locations around the ASEAN member state countries and beyond. Hafiz is an urban designer and also a lecturer/researcher in the field of architecture, urbanism and city planning. Hafiz studied architecture at Universiti Teknologi MARA, Malaysia, Architectural Association School of Architecture, London and Institut Teknologi Bandung, Indonesia. His area of expertise in MERCY Malaysia includes disaster risk reduction and disaster risk management, community planning and urban resilience. Hafiz also currently teaches architecture and urban design at Taylor's University, Malaysia. Hafiz is also the network coordinator for Asia Disaster Reduction and Response Network (ADRNN), a network of 52 civil society organizations across Asia that focuses on disaster risk reduction and disaster response and preparedness, with its secretariat and operational hubs in Kuala Lumpur, Delhi and Tokyo.



Mr. Jin-Long Lu National Kaohsiung University of Science and Technology (Taiwan)

Professor Lu is one of the faculty members of the Department of Shipping and Transportation Management in National Kaohsiung University of Science and Technology (NKUST). He earned his Ph. D. degree at National Cheng Kung University (NCKU) in Tainan, Taiwan in the year of 1999. He had ever been a faculty in Chang Jung Christian University (CJCU) in Taiwan for ten years and the Director of the Department of Aviation and Maritime Management from August 2009 to July 2012. He also visited Purdue University in the US as a visiting scholar hosted by Dr. Srinivas Peeta from September 2007 to August 2008. Professor Lu's main field of interest is behavioral modeling in transport. He is especially interested in issues related to air travel and tourism, aviation and environment, new transport and information technology, and travel survey methods.


